Item. Item. The other two hundred acres part of the before mentioned six hundred & forty acres I Give & Bequeath unto ~~My~~ Susanna Priddy & Patience Priddy my Granddaughters & both Daughters of my Daughter Anne. to them my said Granddaughters their heirs & assigns for ever & to be equally divided between them.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my son George Priddy the plantation whereon I now live together with two hundred & twenty four & a half Acres of Land adjoining including the said plantation, it being one moiety or half part of the whole tract I lately purchased of William Kinchen, the said plantation & land I Give to my son George his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my son William Priddy and to his heirs & assigns for ever two hundred & twenty four & a half Acres of Land the other moiety of the said plantation & land whereon I now live.

Item. I Give & Bequeath to my son Robert Priddy his heirs & assigns for ever a Boy called Roger and my Roger's Girl called Amy together with her increase.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my son William Priddy his heirs & assigns for ever a man called Jack.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my son George Priddy his heirs & assigns for ever a woman called Doll, together with her future Increase.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my son Thomas Priddy Twenty pounds Virginia money to be paid him out of the Money due to me in Virginia from John Jones.

Item. I Give & Bequeath unto my Granddaughters Charity Priddy, Mary Priddy & Harriet Priddy (Orphans of my son Matthew Priddy dead.) each & every of them Ten pounds Prolation money to be paid unto each & every of them respectively as they shall come of Age or Marriage and if it shall happen that any or either of them should die before ^{she or} they shall come of Age or marry, my will is that the Survivor or Survivors shall receive the same.

Imprimis I give and Bequeath unto my son Robert, my only son and
heir for ever, Four hundred & forty acres of Land situate on the South side
of Tar River in the County of Middlesex in Granville County it being part of a
Tract of six hundred & forty Acres I lately purchased of Mr. William Kinchen about
the said four hundred & forty Acres to include the plantation where my said son Robert
now lives.

Item. The other two hundred Acres part of the before mentioned six hundred & forty Acres I give & Bequeath unto ~~Daughter~~ ^{Daughter} Juliana Priddy & Patience Priddy my Granddaughters of both Daughters of my Daughter Anne. to them my said Granddaughters their heirs & assigns for ever & to be equally divided between them.

I Give by Bequeath unto my son George Priddy the Plantation whereon I now live together with two hundred & twenty four & a half Acres of Land adjoining including the said Plantation, it being one moiety or half part of h^e whole tract I lately purchased of William Oware, then.
