I, Charlotte W. Dogiel, of the above said County and State, being of sound mind, but knowing the uncertainty of my earthly life, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First my Executor hereinafter named, shall give my body a suitable burial by the side of my deceased brother James M. Patriest, at Institute in Lewis County, and pay all funeral expenses out of first money which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second - I give and bequeath to my niece, Mrs. W. Buck, fifty Dollars in Cash, all my wearing apparel and one trunk.

Third - I give and bequeath to my niece P. Pauline Stines, One Hundred Dollars in Cash and my little clock and her usual Dogiel picture, that I promised her, also all the pictures she gave me.

Fourth - I give bequeath to my niece, Charlotte W. Barrington, One Hundred Dollars in Cash and the enlarged picture of my deceased husband during her natural life, then to my niece Lema A. Pulpesur.

Fifth - I give and bequeath to my niece, Mary W. B. Allen, One Hundred Dollars in Cash, and one feather bed now in her possession and also my dining table, which she now has.

Sixth - I give and bequeath to my nephew, Dr. James Eliastine Patriest, the following articles: viz. one Ponty Sofa, one large feather bed and its furnishings now and by myself, one Fall bed - stand and Matt. trap; one Bureau, and such books as he may choose & one tin trunk with contents & one sewing machine, one mahogany table as his son of my deceased mother's.

Seventh - I give and bequeath to my niece Anna E. T. Odolan, one hundred Dollars in Cash and one enlarged picture now in her possession.

Eighth - I give and bequeath to my niece,

Isela H. Patriest, two Hundred Dollars in Cash, one feather bed and its furnishings, & anything else she may wish, that belongs to me, not named in my will.

Ninth - I give and bequeath to my sister in law, Nancy E. Patriest one bed stand and mattress now used by my self, and Twenty five Dollars in Cash.

Tenth - I give and bequeath to my great niece, Lema A. Pulpesur, one quilt (Carr's pattern) and the enlarged picture as provided in item four.

Eleventh - I hereby instruct and order my Executor herein after named, to write Samuel B. Fancher, Norfolk, Va. and if found living send my gold watch and such residue of my books as provided in item six but if said Samuel B. Fancher be not found living, the watch becomes the property of my nephew, Dr. James Eliastine Patriest, to whom the gold key belongs in either case.

Twelfth - I desire that the residue of my household and kitchen furniture, not otherwise specified in this will, be equally divided among the children and widow of my deceased brother J. M. Patriest - also I give 25 dollars to put tomb stones to my brother J. P. Patriest's grave.

Thirteenth - I give and bequeath further more to my nephew, Dr. James Eliastine Patriest all residue of money & all notes and other property not disposed of otherwise in this will.

Fourteenth -

I hereby constitute and appoint my nephew Dr. James Eliastine Patriest, my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and purposes of the same, hereby, ratifying and declaring said all other wills, and testaments herebefore made by me -
