I Diversify Cobbs of the County and
State of Orange, King of Sound Mind and Memory but Considering
the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this
my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following
that is to say:

First that my executors herein often named, shall provide
on my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my
family and friends, pay all funeral expenses together with
my just debts, now due and to whom so ever owing part of the
money that may come into his hands, as a part and share
of my estate.

1st Item

I give and devise to my daughter Annie Cobb the sum
of one hundred dollars, to be paid by my executors after
the expiration of two years from my death to be paid
out of the proceeds of the crops raised on my lands
left in the hands of my executors.

2nd Item

To my son Carter I do not leave any part of my
estate as I have already given him my old tract of land
by deed, and the use of said land for diverse years
which I consider a fair share of my estate.

3rd Item

I give and devise to my daughter Ruthie Edwards
one hundred acres of land at part of the Williams tract
Beginning at a point on the Taylor's line at the sum of the
new road and run thence down said road to come to
be made hereafter, and thence to the sum of Mahala Lump
thence up the said Lump to Mr. Taylor's line, thence to the
beginning to certain one hundred acres said land to be
taken into possession of my said daughter after the expiration
of two years from my death, to have to her and her heirs forever.

4th Item

I direct that my Son James H. Cobb shall open a road beginning
at the end of the road on the South side of Dick Headings
house, and run said road straight to the Snow Hill and
Willow road, which piece of New road shall be the
dividing line between the Williams tract of land and
my home place known as the Mrs. M. Edwards tract and
I give and devise to my said Son James all the balance
of the Williams tract of land and that portion of the home
road cut off by laying off said road to have to him and
his heirs forever I request to my said Son my cattle farm

5th Item

I give and devise to my two youngest Sons J. S. Cobb and
Edward Cobb my home tract of land it to be equally divided
between them, that is to say they shall have an equal number of
acres of said land Edward to have the part on which my dwelling
is situated and John the upper or hilltop part of the tract, the
division line to begin on the hill road and run thence South or
in a southerly direction to Mr. Bills land, & it is my will and
desire that if either of my Sons Edward or John shall die before
they arrive at the age of twenty one, and shall leave no heirs
of their body, then I desire that the part of my estate devised
bequeathed to them or either one of them shall be divided between
my surviving children except my daughter Annie Jackson
who is not to share in said estate.

6th Item

I give and bequeath to my Sons James H. J. S. and Edward
all of my horses, Mules, Cattle, Hogs and poultry belonging
to me at my death, also all of my farming tools of every description
Carto 100 acres, buggy horses and all else of my household &
Kitchen furniture of every kind and description, my Cotton Press
all noted and account belonging to me to be equally divided between
the said James, John and Edward, in the following manner, my Son
James is to have said personal property and stock and its increase
for himself and in trust for J. S. and Edward James shall
have the use of said property free of charge, and when John
shall arrive at the age of twenty one years, they shall each
choose more valuable said personal property found in
this Estate (Should they fail to agree then they call in the
man and take said property and its increase
and James may pay to John the amount of such valuation
for his one third part of said property if he should desire
to purchase it, otherwise if they is to take said property already
to him at his share of my personal estate provided however
if James and John & Ed. can at they shall be come twenty one
years of age agree between themselves, they can make said
division without calling in outside parties) after said division
with other the remaining two thirds to be thrown back into
common stock, and when Edward shall be come twenty one
years of age a like proceeding to be had for division between
them.

7th Item

I give and bequeath to my Son James H. Cobb, my Barn,
Fodder, oats, hay, and all provisions on hand at time of
my death, to enable him to carry on my farm. I also give
and bequeath to my Son James all the crops of every description
planted to be planted, growing or to be grown upon my lands
and change him with the payment out of the proceeds derived
