

Last - Will and Testament - of
Elizabeth - Edwards , etc.

State of North Carolina - Greene County -
I Elizabeth Edwards of Greene County and State of
North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory
but considering the uncertainty of earthly existence, do
make and declare this my last Will and Testament -
in manner and form following, this - is to say:

First - That - my executors shall after my death provide
for my body a decent burial and pay all my funeral
expenses out of my property.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Omund
the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid by my executors
out of any money belonging to my estate to be thrown out
at her disposal absolutely forever.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Caroline Edwards
the sum of twenty dollars. Her rights and property forever.
To be paid by my executors as she shall require.

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Lela Carr,
one feather bed to queen size - four hundred dollars to
be paid to my son George Edwards. whom I appoint
as her trustee, and to be held by the said George Edwards
and applied to her support and education. But - when the
said Lela Carr shall have arrived at the age of twenty-
one years, the surplus which my means shall then be
less, and there is before this time she shall have been
married. If the said Lela Carr dies before she marries
or arrives at the age of twenty-one years, then it is my will
that all my property going to the said Lela Carr from
me shall be equally divided between my heirs.

I give and bequeath to my son Franklin Edwards the sum
of fifteen dollars to be paid to him by my executors out of
any money belonging to my estate not otherwise disposed
of, to be his as his property forever.

I give and bequeath to my son George Edwards the sum
of fifteen dollars. As his rights and property forever, to be
paid by my executors in the same manner as the law
requires.

My wife and heirs is this - the residue of my property
shall be equally divided between my daughters,
Margaret Omund and Caroline Edwards, and
my grand daughter Lela Carr
and soley. I do hereby constitute and appoint my
