Pitt and the State of North Carolina, being of
sound mind & memory but considering the uncertainty
of my earthly existence, do make and declare
this my last will and testament in manner and
form following, that is to say

Fint. That my Executor hereinafter named shall provide
for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes
of my relatives and friends, and payment of all
expenses together with all my just debts, however
and whenever owing, out of the money that may
first come into his hands as a part or part
of my estate, including the purchasing & placing
stones at the head and foot of my grave

Second - I give devise and bequeath to my wife
Ida Beaman, wife of William Beaman, one bed
and stand and bed clothing for the stand.

Third -

I give and bequeath to my nieces Rita Holloman one
bed and bed stand and clothing for the bed.

Fourth.

I give and bequeath to my nephews Chas M. Bergeson
and Wiley Dildy son of Jos T. Dildy, the beds, bed
stands and clothing for the beds and also the bed room
suite in the room known as the parlor, equally
divided between them.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my sisters Bessie Mann
Ida Beaman, & Rita Holloman, all of my pictures
in the parlor equally divided between them

Sixth - I give and bequeath to my nephew, Wiley Dildy
son of Jos T. Dildy, one cow man named Miller owned
by me and under my possession.

I give and devise to my nephews Elias McE.
Bergeson and Wiley Dildy son of Jos T. Dildy all that
tract of land now owned by me to them ^{in fee simple}
forever

Eighth.

My will and desire is that all the residue of my
estate including beds, bed clothing, household and
kitchen furniture, miles, cattle hogs, trees & corn
felder all the crops of every description that may
be upon the farm after taking out the above and the
legacies above mentioned shall be sold and the
debts owing to me collected and if there be any
surplus over and above the paying of debts,
expenses & legacies, that such surplus shall
be equally divided and paid over to my nieces and
nephews (viz) Ida Beaman, Rita Holloman, Chas
M. Bergeson and Wiley Dildy son of Jos T. Dildy in
equal portions, share and share alike to them and each
and every of them their executors, administrators and assigns
absolutely forever, after giving each of my nieces and
nephews not less than twenty five dollars in money to them
or their personal representative.

Ninth - Now whereas my nephew Wiley Dildy son of Jos
T. Dildy is a minor of about twelve years of age and
be of full age of twenty one until the 15th of September
1914, now therefore, my will and desire is that B. A.
Carraway is hereby appointed and constituted guardian
of my nephew to have and to hold the custody
and guardianship both of his respective person and
estate, until the time said Wiley Dildy the son of Jos
T. Dildy shall personally arrive at the full age of
twenty one years.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my
trusted friend C. L. Garrett, my lawful executor
to all intents and purposes, to execute this my
last Will and Testament according to the true
intent and meaning of the same and every part and
item thereof, lawfully choosing and declaring utterly void
all other wills and Testaments by me hitherto made.

In witness whereof, I the said Elizabeth Bergum do herunto set my hand and seal this the 28th day of April 1905.
