- In the name of God I Jesse Wood Ann. this I Jesse Wood of the County of Cherokee and State of North Carolina this I am in my sound mind & memory in the year of our Lord eight hundred and forty eight from the 16th day. this I Jesse Wood this day do hereby these presents do acknowledge that which is my last will and testament do hereby bequeath & bequeath unto my beloved wife the land where I now live with all its premises and improvements there belonging to it - her natural life time and Murphy place to and all household & kitchen furniture and farming tools and all cows and faddens, Bacon, Hens, Hogs, Sheep & cattle, Cows and riding carriage to her natural life time undivided - to keep my children together & I chose them
- 2 I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Harp. Bridget of land Negro boy Pink and Mary these all who intend do one of the rest of children should die with any kind of lawful heirs of them today that is all that I intend for her.
 - 3 I give unto daughter Fannie. to have whenever she leaves or marries
 - 4 I give unto daughter Bonaparte. King whenever she leaves or marries.
 - 5 I give unto daughter James. whenever she leaves or marries

- 6 I give unto daughter Anna. Sarah whenever she leaves or marries
 - 7 I give unto daughter Jesse Ann. Lear whenever she leaves or marries
 - 8 I give unto daughter Elmira whenever she leaves or marries
 - 9 I give unto daughters Elany. Bayden whenever she leaves or marries
- The remainder of my Negroes that is not named to be divided between my Sons Youngest - Daughters after the death of my wife and land some tract and Murphy tract and all stock, other articles that are not named. I point - Benjamin Wood to be my executor to my last will and testament. to be my executor also to this will and testament. the day and date above written

I Henry Sugg of the County of Cherokee and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say: this 1st I bequeath to my beloved wife Elsie Sugg the plantation where I now live, to go with all the following negroes, viz, one woman named Rose, one do. Kagan, one do. Lucy, one girl named Betsy, one do. Cherry, one boy named Ben one girl named Suetley, with all my house hold and kitchen furniture, stock of all kind, at my home plantation all the plantation hereditals of every kind, and all the movables on hand as my depts. the above property to be bequeathed to her my said wife during her natural life or widowhood

this 2^d I give and bequeath to my Son Thos. H. Sugg one hundred & 1/4 acres of land known as the Miller place together with one bed & furniture at the death of my
