restraint by their knowledge, information or belief.

It is thereupon considered, adjudged and decided,

law and that said paper writing is and contains
the last will and Testament of Leoretia Edwords,
deceased. And on motion it is ordered that
said will be admitted to probate and
recorded in the Book of Wills of Greene
County and as such filed as provided
by law in the office of the Clerk of
Superior Court of said County.
It is further ordered that said Haywood
Edmonson be allowed to qualify as
executor as provided by law and enter
upon the discharge of the duties imposed
by said trust.

I John Q. Pollard of the aforesaid
County considering the uncertainty of my earthly
existence, and being in sound health both of
mind and body do make and declare this
my last will and Testament:

First - I consign my soul to my maker who
gave it and I leave my body to be buried
by my Executor, to be interred named in
a manner suitable to the wishes of my family
and friends. and he shall pay all expenses
of the same together with all my just
day & board debts out of the first moneys
that shall come into his hands as a
part or parcel of my estate.

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah Pollard
three hundred dollars of my personal estate
to be paid to her by my Executor immediately
after my death.

Item 2nd The remainder of my personal estate I give
and bequeath to my wife Sarah Pollard,
My daughter Mary E. Edwords wife of B. W.
Edwords, and my son W. A. Pollard to be
divided equally between them share and
share alike.

Item 3d I give bequeath and devise to my daughter
Mary E. Edwords wife of B. W. Edwords, the
tract of land in Pitt County known as the
Mr. Arthur Place containing one hundred and
fifty five and one half acres and subject in
Greene County North Carolina adjoining the
lands of Haywood & wife. The higher land
and the lands of B. W. Edwords continuing by
estimation one hundred and ten acres,
upon condition that she pay to my wife
Sarah Pollard the sum of \$500.00
annually as long she may live to her and
her heirs forever. In the event however that
my said daughter Mary E. Edwords
shall die without leaving any living issue
begotten of her body then and in that case
the said tracts of land shall go to my son
W. A. Pollard upon the same conditions
as it was devised to my daughter Mary E.

Item 4th The remainder of my real estate consisting of and including my home tract or the tract on which I now live containing one hundred and seventy five acres, a tract adjoining purchased from G. T. Pyron containing one hundred and fifty three acres and one tract purchased from Alfred Forbes containing eighteen acres making a total of three hundred and forty six acres, I give bequeath and devise to my son W.C. Pollard to him and his heirs forever upon the condition that he take care of his mother and pay her the sum of One hundred dollars annually during her natural life.

Item 5th The yearly amounts to be paid to my wife by my son and daughter are given her in kind offhand as it is my will and desire that they shall have the control of the land willed to them and the sums paid yearly by them with the money and personal property willed to her wife be sufficient to give her a comfortable living.

I testify I institute and appoint my son William L. Pollard my lawful Executor to this my last will and testament to execute the same according to the true intent and meaning thereof.
