I give and bequeath unto my grand son Huber L. Howard, all the notes that I hold against him to the date hereof, also one bed and bedstead, up stairs, and one half of my interest in the Town lot in the Town of Wilson known as the Duvall home and lot, the whole of which were being owned by myself and the wife of the late Mrs Tabitha May, to have and to hold the said one half of my said one half interest in fee.
