- 1 I want a suitable & decent burial for my body and my just debts to be paid.
- 2 I give to Leab Wallace Twenty five dollars in money.
- 3 I give to J. A. Wallace Twenty five dollars in money, a gilt-
sore pig.
- 4 I give to Charles Ormond twenty five dollars in money,
one walking stick and one iron pot.
- 5 I give to Joseph Harper his choice bedstead, bed &
sufficient cover for the same, my gun, sewing machine
one sow & four pigs.
- 6 I give to Moranda Ormond one bed, one bed quilt,
two Shirts.
- 7 I give my wearing apparel to Hannah Harper;
also one bed, four bed quilts, two presses, one big iron
pot, my crockery ware, knives & forks, & spoons, one
mule, two tables, two trunks, my cotton, corn, fodder
and hogs.
- 8 I give one press in the kitchen to Ciley Patrick, also
one narrow bread tray.
- 9 I want the engine sold and the money for the
same divided between Hannah Harper's children.
- 10 The residue of my property I give to Hannah
Harper.
- 11 I do nominate and appoint James Hardy to be
the executor to this my last will and testament.

and testament, in presence of the witnesses named
below.
