at my death to be sold and the proceeds equally divided between my
living children

Item Fourth, All the balance of my property of any kind whatever
I divide between my two lawful daughters Alice & Elizabeth
Thompson

I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Cooper Barnes Executor
to this my last will and Testament

Nothing void all and any will
or wills at any time heretofore made by me and do declare this to
be my last will and Testament
