I Reddick Browning, of the County of Greene and State of North Carolina, being in health of body and of sound mind and understanding, please be to God for the same, do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following:

Item First, I give devise and bequeath unto my lawful daughter Alice Thompson the Bedstead Bed, Bed covering that I bought from Mrs. S.P. Cox. Also one Saddle and what belongs thereto.

Item Second, I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Williams the Bedstead & Bed and covering that I have owned all my life.

Item third, At my death my ^{portion} my White Buggy and Cart if I should own any at my death to be sold and the proceeds equally divided between my living children.

Item Fourth, All the balance of my property of any kind whatever I divide between my two lawful daughters Alice & Elizabeth Thompson.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Cooper Barnes Executor to this my last will and Testament.

Nothing void all and any will or wills at any time heretofore made by me and do declare this to be my last will and Testament.
