

Archibald Surman's Will.

State of S. Carolina,

Greiford County } January 16, 1857.

Whereas, I Archibald Surman being in firm in body, but sound in mind do make & ordain this my last will as follows.

I will my wife Fanny about one half my land, say beginning at Thomas Butler's corner, to the Shavers line running East to the Shavers corner, thence through my field as the fence runs to a gum bush at the bottom, thence East from said bush to Colvin Finner's line, that is the South part during her widowhood. I now will that she have a necessary part of farming tools to carry on the small farm which I am willing my son John Surman shall set out for her, also I will to my daughter Priscilla one bed & furniture, one cow & calf, 2 Hogs, one horse, the balance of the house hold property I will to my wife Fanny during her life. The North half of my land I will to the children of Fanny my first wife. After the death of my wife Fanny I will that the South part of my land be sold & two hundred dollars of the amount given to my daughter Priscilla & that the balance of the amount be then divided between all my children of my last wife Fanny. I will fifteen dollars to my daughter Polly Hull & fifteen dollars

I will my wife Fanny about one half my land, say beginning at Thomas
Baker's corner, to the Shavers line running east to the Shaw's corner, thence
through my field as the fence runs to a gum bush at the bottom, thence
east from said bush to Calvin Finner's line, that is the South part during
her widowhood. I now will that she have a necessary part of farming tools
to carry on the small farm which I am giving my son John Bruman shall
fit out for her, also I will to my daughter Fessilla one bed & furniture,
one cow & calf, 2 sheep, one human, the balance of the house hold property
I will to my wife Fanny during her life. The back half of my land
I will to the children of Nancy my first wife after the death of my wife
Fanny. I will that the South part of my land be sold & two hundred
dollars of the amount given to my daughter Fessilla & that the balance
of the amount be then divided between all my children of my last wife Fanny.
I will fifteen dollars to my daughter Betsy Hull & fifteen dollars
to my son Archibald & fifteen dollars to Martha Pitt & ten dollars to
Betsy Hull, ten dollars to Celie Graham. I will thirty five
dollars to the children of my daughter Lydia Wain, that is the thirty
five divided amongst the four. I consider that my daughter Nancy
Hutton & the children of my daughter Jane Meredith have had their

part of my estate except as willed in the last I will after having made
the foregoing bequest, if any money or property be left after the death of my
wife Mary, that it be equally divided between all my children of both wives.
My will is that my son John Burman carry out his my last will and
