Barlett a native of Virginia but for upwards of Eight years last past a Sojourner in South Carolina principally in Lawrence District during the whole of that time I have been more or less labouring under the disease that I believe is now about to take me from this world of trouble & affliction; Where I feeble man have attempted to bear my lot with all the fortitude that I was able to call together — first and all that is important to me —

I pray thine the Great & Merciful God the Giver of all that is Good Wise & Great in this world, or that which is to come —

Will forgive my soul for the many sin's I have committed in this world, against his holy & righteous Law, knowingly or unknowingly by thought word or deed, & he will grant my soul a place of rest in his Happy regions above, when my days may cease to be numbered here below —

Touching my worldly diese It gives me pain to trouble fellow man particular those who I have never rendered any service to, and am now very certain in my own mind that I never shall die if I have as much I wish to be buried anywhere it may please & be convenient for a person or persons who may do that last & important favor, and the amount of the sum paid out of my little money I have for traveling to Richmond if there be a Sufficiency in my possession if not I beg & hope Capt Young will take the trouble to sell or direct to be sold any part of my clothing &c that will bring that sum.

I further beg that Capt Young will receive my shaving glass & tools for his own use as a mark of that respect due him from me — And if the sum I have above requested to be received & paid from my clothing and so forth, may not make it necessary to sell my silver watch & if there may be any surplus clothing or any thing remaining I am in hopes & beg that Capt

Young will receive them & make what or any use or destruction of them he may think proper and my will or Will is completed with him under my hand & seal this 10th day of October 1821.
