if legally demanded

One Dollar if legally demanded

9th To my son Nathan or his heirs the sum of One Dollar if legally demanded

10th I give to my Daughter Bulah that married Calib Gaudin or his heirs
One Dollar if legally demanded

11th I give to my Daughter Emanna that married Timothy H Seape the sum
of One Dollar if legally demanded

12th I give to my Daughter Edith that married Weldon Charles the sum
of One Dollar if legally demanded

13th I give to my Daughter Ruth that married Japh Threber the sum
of One Dollar if legally demanded

of One Dollar if legally demanded

13th I give to my Daughter Ruth that married Japh Thoburn the sum
of One Dollar if legally demanded

14th To my son Curtis One Dollar whom I name & appoint my Execu-
tor full power to sell the balance of my land to the best advantage

Order to pay off the demands against me together with the Rescued property
 & I should not have to do it myself and further if there should be a balance
 and what may be sufficient for the Care Center may have of me, I want the
 two youngest Children Mary & Ann to be at least Reared to read &
 Write and both of them placed in good Families particularly to be
 brought up among Friends and if any thing should remain I want it
 placed at Interest or to the best advantage for the benefit of them the said
 Mary & Annas.

North Carolina This is the Nuncupative Will of William Rankin Dec'd William
 Guilford County 5th this Twenty eighth of September in the year of our Lord
 One Thousand Eight hundred & twenty nine which is as follows viz
 It was his Will & request that the old Plantation be sold & the old
 Wagon and Sled and all the stock that his wife could spare for to pay
 his Debts and the remainder of the property to be at his wife's disposal
 and for her to get one of his or her friends to attend her or who she pleased
 For mentioned that he was not able to do it himself.

William Rankin related these words on the seventh of September in the
 year of our Lord 1829 & died on the twentieth of the same
 Test Samuel E. Donnell
