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I declare, I give to my wife One Bed & furniture her Choice I also give to her her Choice of my Horses One of them together with the Senn & Spinning Wheel also One Side Saddle On the Value of the same I also give to my wife as much of the Crose & Stocke as will be sufficient for One years maintenance After my Deceas the above mentioned Articles all Except the Land to be sold at my Wifes Death or at the Expiration of her Widowhood By my Executors And the Money by them Received Among my three Youngest Children Namely Cummings Nelson & Buchanan, I also Give to my wife One Cow & Calf to be Disposed of in the same manner as the above mentioned Article, I give to my wife One Hundred Dollars.

Third I give & bequeath to my Eldest Daughter Elizabeth Ten Shillings.

Fourth I give & bequeath to my Eldest Daughter Elizabeth Youngest Child which she has or may have Two Hundred & Fifty Dollars the Interest to be Paid Yearly By my Executors to the said Childs mother,

the amount of the estate now able to the Will admits. That is  
to be sufficient to little advantage without it that they  
have between them my piece of Land lying on the South side  
of Crumberg near the Town

Twelfth I will that the Remaining part of my last Personal  
Effects Lands & Other property set before mentioned in my  
Will be sold at my executors by my Executors & the overplus  
of the money after settling with the Legatees agreeable to the Will  
by my Executors to be Equally Divided among my Children  
And do hereby make and Ordain my Worthy friends Robert  
May bin my Executors of this my Last Will & Testament
