

In the name of God Amen I Quincy Jenkins of the State of North Carolina County of Guilford Being of sound mind & memory Blessed be God Do this Second Day of December 1817 Make & Publish This my Last Will & Testament In manner following First To my Daughter Jinny Ricks I Give & bequeath that Tract & Parcel of Land I purchased of Colin Auvill & all the Other property I formerly lent to Jinny Ricks & Two Hundred & Eighty Dollars Two Years After this date To be paid to her.

Secondly. I Give & bequeath to my son Peter Jenkins One Horse & One Mare, One Cow Two Beds & Furniture & all the Other property that I have on the Land where I now live Also I Give to my son Peter Jenkins Two Negroes (viz) Hannah & Flora, Also One bond on Samuel Webb One Hundred Dollars & One for Eight, One on William Wind One Hundred & 19th & 75 cents, and my son Peter out of this money he Collects of these Bonds is to pay all my Just Bills. & To my Daughter Polly Partin I Give Twenty Shillings.

And I hereby make & Ordain my beloved son Peter Jenkins and my worthy friend Andrew Black Executors to this my Will & Testament In Witness Whereof I set my hand & Seal in the presence of us
