In the Name of God Amen, I Elias Wharton of the County of Cutgood &
State of North Carolina being of sound Mind & disposing Memory
but being sensible of the Mortality of my body and that it is appoin-
ted for all Men once to die, do make this as my last Will &
Testament, in the following Manner

- 1st I give unto the Children of my son Joseph, viz, Elias, Warren, Emily & Susan,
One Dollar each to be held by them and their heirs forever.
- 2^d I give unto my son William the Plantation that I bought of Peter Mauckly
& Thomas Dick containing One hundred & Twenty two Acres be the same
more or less, and One Acre of One hundred Dollars, which I hold on my
son Robert. I wish that the whole profits of said plantation and the
proceeds of improvement of said premises shall be vested in him
during his Natural life but not to be sold or transferred by him,
or be liable to be sold by Execution, for any Debt which he may

Orato. but in consequence of either of his houses should sell & remove to any other part of the world, and he should wish to go with them in that case either of them so removing is authorized to sell said plantation provided the money is laid out in Land, for the use of him in the same manner as above written likewise One Tractor Bed & furniture.

8y. I give unto my son Robert One horse, bridle, & saddle, One Tractor bed & furniture The plantation whereon I now live and One third of my Mills Only he is to find his Sister Marches a good & sufficient Maintenance out of the proceeds of said plantation & Two Dollars in Cash Annually and if she chooses to live with him, in that case she is not to be turned out of the house where I now live without her free Consent during her single life.

9y. I give unto my Daughter Marches Two Tractor beds & furniture, my spinning wheel, and all the furniture it may contain, One horse bridle & saddle, One Cow, One spinning wheel, & cards, and One Note of One hundred Dollars, which I hold on my son Sifer, to be held by her & her heirs forever.

10y. I wish my Smith Shop & Tools to be kept on the plantation for the joint use of all my sons Sifer, Williams, Samuel & Robert.

11y. It is my wish that my two Negroes Daniel & May should be jointly provided for by my Children, if either or both of them should become a charge.

12y. I wish all my kitchen furniture of all sorts to stay on the plantation place for the use of Robert & Marches as long as they shall live together and in case my Daughter Marches should marry to be equally divided between them.

13y. The Balance of my Estate not herein devised I wish to be sold and the proceeds thereof to be applied, to the payment of all my Just Debts and the balance to be equally divided between my three Daughters Jane Atkins, Abigail Bell & Marches.

Now. I nominate & appoint my two sons Sifer & Samuel Executors of this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal this fourteenth day of February One Thousand Eight hundred & Thirty two

One Spanning Wheel, & cards, and One Note of One hundred Dollars, which I hold
on my son Sips, to be held by her & her heirs forever.

7y. I wish my Smith Shop & Tools to be kept on the plantation for the joint
use of all my sons Sips Williams Daniel & Robert.

8y. It is my wish that my two Negroes Daniel & May should be jointly provided for
by my Children, if either or both of them should become as Charge.

9y. I wish all my Kitchen furniture of all sorts to stay on the plantation placed
for the use of Robert & Marches as long as they shall live together and in case
my Daughter Marches should marry to be equally divided between them.

10y. The balance of my Estate, not herein devised I wish to be sold and the proceeds
thereof to be applied, to the payment of all my Just Debts and the balance
to be equally divided between my three daughters Jane Abner, Abner
Belle & Marches.

Now I nominate & appoint my two sons Sips & Daniel Executors of this my last
Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Affixed my Seal, this fourteenth day of February One thousand Eight hundred
& Thirty two
