In the Name of God Amen. I Elisha Mottner of August County - State of Maryland this 29th day of May Eighteen Hundred & thirty being weak in body but of sound mind & Memory & Calling to mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die, do make & Ordain this my Last Will & Testament, & in the first place I recommend my soul into the Hands of God who gave it & my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian & decent manner at the direction of my Executor receiving thereof & in the first place as regards such worldly property as God has blessed me with in this life, I dispose of in the manner following. I wish all my last debts to be fully satisfied & paid together with my funeral Expenses out of my Estate.

I give & bequeath to my Father Timothy Mottner & my Mother Elizabeth Mottner my Negro Girl Charlotte during their Natural lives, My Negro Girl Thankful I will to be sold unless my Father choose to pay off my Debt out of my money or property and in case he does so he is to have her during his life.

I Will & bequeath to my Brother Peter Mottner all that piece or parcel of Land which I bought from him containing Eighty Acres more or less.

I Will & bequeath to my Father my Mares & Cattle. I also Will & bequeath to my Father my Wagon & Gear - I further give & bequeath to my Father all my Stock of Hogs. My Will & desire further is that Peter Mottner have a Note which I have on him without paying any thing, My Horse Called Kant & my Saddle & bridle I bequeath to Peter Mottner.

My Will & desire further is that all the property that I have Willed to my Father & Mother during their lives, shall at their death be Equally divided between Alfred Mottner, Peter Mottner & Christopher Mottner.

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My Will & desire further is that my dear Pelly Kuper be paid the sum of Three Dollars out of my Estate.

I hereby further constitute, nominate & appoint my truly friend Peter Monette Executor to this my last Will & Testament, Enjoining, Witnessing, & Announcing, all and every other James White & Wills, Executor or Executors, allowing, Confirming & ratifying this to be my last Will & Testament.

In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth Harris of the County of Surgo & State of North Carolina being of a perfect & sound Mind & Memory (blessed be God) do this Eighteenth Day of September in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred & thirty, Make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say.

First I Give and bequeath to my son Joseph Harris ten Barrels of Corn & ten bushels of Wheat & three hundred pounds of Pork, for him to possess forever, Likewise all the Claims I have against him as Guardian, and all other Claims

Second I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Abigail Pyles three barrels of Corn five bushels of Wheat & two hundred pounds of Pork, to possess forever.

Third I Give & bequeath to my son Henry Harris the sum of Two Dollars to possess forever.

Fourth It is my Will & desire that after paying all my last debts the remaining part of all my property be equally divided amongst all my surviving Children my son Henry Harris excepted.

And I hereby make and Ordain my two sons James H. & Joseph Harris
