I give and bequeath to my Daughter my Granddaughter Mary Ann
Two Negro boys named Co. also One bed & furniture & Bedstead
also One Cow. I give my Granddaughter Mariah One bed & furniture
I give to my Daughter Darcas the other two Negroes that is to say Moses &
Red, to her lifetime then to pass to two of her Children that is to
say to Martha & Thomas. I give also & give my Cattle to said
Thomas

I also give to my Daughter Darcas Two Hundred Acres of Land, during
her lifetime then to pass to her two Children, Mariah & Thomas.
I also give to my Daughter Darcas all my Crop and Stock and
farming Implements. Also Mary Ann is to have her dower also

Be it remembered this twenty fourth day of the fourth Month in the year of our
Lord One thousand eight hundred & twenty seven that I James Henry of Endicott
County in the State of North Carolina, being in health & of sound mind & memory

It is my will that my land on the south side of Richland Creek to London
as follows. Begin at a stone in the lane, near the south
East corner of the garden, thence run North nine poles to a stone
