

by the name of God amen I Eliza Westman of Guilford County State of North Carolina being weak in body but in sound mind and memory blessed be God I do bequeath my soul to God and my body to be buried and I to this this county Court day of August Anno Domini 1842 in manner following that is to say I will publish this my last will & testament in manner following that is to say I will that my body be buried in a decent Christian manner & the expense thereof to be paid out of my estate and all my last debts to be fully paid & I bequeath the balance of my estate I reserve in the following manner to wit

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ann Conway one black & white quick fat bay cow possession to her her heirs & assigns forever

Item I bequeath to my son John Westman one barrel hogstom & one barrel flour & one pair of flint guns and one looking glass to him his heirs & assigns forever

Item I bequeath to my Daughter Charity Westman one large pot and one cover now in the hands of John Conway & one walnut table & two sheep pen & since & son Hollan or money to her her heirs and assigns forever

Item I give to my Grand Son Elisha Westman son of John Westman one wooden bed and furniture to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Westman my new barrel cloth coat and

Now I give and bequeath to my son William Kirkman my new Patent Clockcase and
Wrist Coat and one pair Patent leather shoes & my ring coat and my hat
and my last shirt, to have his free and separate possession

Now I give and bequeath to my three sons George John & George Kirkman the residue of
my estate to be equally divided among them

Now I bequeath to my five children hereafter named John John George & all children
whom they all the balance or remainder of my estate to be divided among them
and I leave an equal share in the division to be made by them or more of
them choosing to them their own and others as they see

Now I do make manate of this & declare my last will & testament in writing whereof
I have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day
& year above written
