It is my will that all the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my sister Anne Beltrach her heirs and my nephews I name Archibald William Pett, E. C. Pett, Edw. Pett & Martha Pett & I appoint my distinguished names Beltrach my Executor to this my last will & testament. This is at given 1848
