a low state of health but in sound mind and memory but calling to mind
the mortality of the body and knowing that it is appointed once to die and
after death to Judgement. I do therefore make canobles and appoint
this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit -
I sincerely and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God ~~that~~ gave it my body to be buried a decent and
Christian manner not troubling but I shall receive the same again
at the great day of Judgement by the mighty power of God - and
as touching the worldly affairs that it has pleased God to bless me
with I do desire as follows. First I give and bequeath unto my
son Jacob Crossman the land and place I now live are supposed
to be 61 acres it being the land left me by husband Joseph
Crossman dead, one pair of Hedges and one blue backle one high
fenced wood stand, one flat down

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Esther Holman
my room and all the gear and apparatus thereto belonging
one brown cloth one large sheet two wood stands all my wearing
of cloth. I do also bequeath unto my daughter Mary

as touching the worldly affairs that it has pleased God to bless me
with I do desire as follows. First I give and bequeath unto my
son Jacob Crisman the land and place I now live and supposed
to be 61 acres it being the land left me by husband Joseph
Crisman dead. One pair of Hatzgants or a blue hackle one high
pruned Wood stand, one flt Iron

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Esther Holman
my Iron and all the Gear and apparatus thereto belonging
one horse chest one bag short two Wood stands all my wearing
clothes. Thirdly I give and bequeath unto Sally Horner one
billion sheet one flax wheel one billion turn for value
of her Receipt. The billions of my property to be equally divi-
ded between my two children Jacob and Esther to be divi-
ded at their own discretion And I do make constitute and
appoint my sons Jacob Crisman and Spencer A Holman
Executors to this my last Will and testament as witnesses whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th
day of November, A.D. 1836.
