I George Cummins of Guilford County and State of North Carolina being very sick but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God callins into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and after death to Judgment I do make this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of the Almighty God that gave it and my body to the earth to be decently buried in Christian manner nothing but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wheresoever it have pleased the Lord to Bless us with in this life I give and devise and dispose in the following manner and form.

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Cummins all my stock of all kinds likewise all my household furniture and plantation utensils during her life Likewise 250 acres of land in Cumberland on the water the creek called Wolf pond all to be at disposal.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Cummins 250 acres of land more or less being on each side of my Justice River and on both sides of xxx Saw River and between Thomas Cummins line and Hugh Cummins line and Edward Bullock and John Medearis and Wm. Bagwells to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son John Cummins five shillings starting.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Cummins five shillings.

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my son George five shillings starting.

Sixthly I give unto my daughter Elisabeth five shillings starting.

Seventhly I give and bequeath unto my Son James five shillings starting.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son John Cummins five shillings Sterling.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Cummins five shillings.

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my son Lutz five shillings Sterling.

Sixthly I give unto my daughter Elisabeth five shillings Sterling.

Seventhly I give and bequeath unto my Son Hans five shillings Sterling.

Eighthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah five shillings Sterling.

Ninthly I give unto my daughter Mathew five shillings Sterling.

Tenthly I give unto my son Charles five shillings Sterling.

Eleventhly I give to my son Hugh five shillings Sterling.

And I do hereby fully discharge debts and demand all and every other Testament
wills legacies bequeathes whatsoever and I do by these presents constitute and appoint my beloved
wife Sarah Cummins & my son Joseph Cummins the sole Executors of this my last will and Testament
confirming this and no other. In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth
day of December one thousand eight hundred and five.
