my wife Mary and children except my three sons boys to draught  
half share of what is to be sold.

I also stand witness abiding by the will with my family  
here the names of the 3 above two sons and a brother and  
I hereby make and declare my wife Mary Finley and  
my son William Finley Executors of this my last will  
and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and  
seal the day and year above written.
