In the name of God amen. I George Ingle, Senr. of the County of Guilford
and State of North Carolina being of sound sense and memory but low in health considering
the uncertainty of human life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do
make herein and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth.

Expressis - I commit my body to the dust to be buried in a decent and
Christian manner - My soul into the hands of the living God hoping for salvation through
the mediation of Christ Jesus, - and as to the worldly property which kind providence
has been pleased to bestow upon me I will it to be distributed as followeth -

1st - I will all my just debts to be well and truly paid after the discharge of
which together with my funeral expenses

I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret one hundred and
fifty nine acres of land including the plantation on which I now live it being the
whole part of my old tract, to be her own site and property during the remaining part
of her life, but at her death or marriage to become the site and property of my youngest
and beloved son Adam I likewise give and bequeath to my sd wife all the money
which I now have on hand, two horses, two cows, two head of sheep, all my stock of
hens which I now have, such farming instruments as are now on the plantation which she
may think proper to keep in order to carry on the business of farm, one bed and
chamber furniture also my waggon, six pewter plates, 6 knives and 6 forks two iron
stoves and such other kitchen furniture as she may think proper to keep.

2dly - I give and bequeath to my eldest and beloved son Barnabas
the tract of land on which he now lives containing as is supposed 200 acres
to him and to his heirs forever

4thly - I give and bequeath to my two sons George and John

make herein and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form so followeth.

1st I commit my body to the dust to be buried in a decent and Christian manner - My soul into the hands of the living God hoping for salvation through the mediation of Christ Jesus, - and as to the worldly property which kind providence has been pleased to bestow upon me I will it to be distributed as followeth.

1st I will all my just debts to be well and truly paid after the discharge of which together with my funeral expences

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret one hundred and fifty nine acres of land including the plantation on which I now live it being the 1st part of my old tract, to be her own site and property during the remaining part of her life, but at her death or marriage to become the site and property of my youngest and beloved son Adam. I likewise give and bequeath to my sd wife all the money which I now have on hand, two horses, two cows, two head of sheep, all my stock of tools which I now have, such farming instruments as are now on the plantation which she may think proper to keep in order to carry on the business of farm, one bed and furniture also my waggon, six pewter plates, 6 knives and 6 forks two iron kettles and such other kitchen furniture as she may think proper to keep.

2nd I give and bequeath to my eldest and beloved son Barnabas the tract of land on which he now lives containing as is supposed 200 acres to him and to his heirs forever

3rd I give and bequeath to my two sons George and Josiah a tract or parcel of land lying on the South and East sides of the old tract on which I now live containing as is supposed one hundred and eight acres together with my saw and grist mills standing upon the same

8thly - I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Ingle one hundred and
 shillings to be struck off the upper part of my aforesaid old tract.

9thly - I give and bequeath to my son Ludwick Ingle the tract of land
 on which he now lives containing as is supposed one hundred and sixty five acres
 in which being now disputed should it be taken away by any other
 claim then each heir which have or will be mentioned in this will to pay to him
 (my son Ludwick) so much as will make his part of my estate as an heir equal
 to that of the others but should the right to sd land remain undisturbed then he
 my sd son Ludwick is to pay to each of my sons George & John fifteen pounds.

10thly - I give and bequeath to each of my three youngest daughters Philippa,
 Lovina and Sophia two cows and calves, two sheep one bed & its furniture, one
 chest, two iron pots, one frying pan one spinning wheel two pewter dishes six
 pewter plates and six common pewter spoons.

11thly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret wife to Mr. White
 five pounds to be paid to her or her heirs in money.

12thly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda the sum of five
 pounds to be paid in cash.

13thly - I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Eve living daughter
 of my daughter Barbara living the sum of five pounds to be paid in cash and
 to her father George living I give five shillings to be paid in cash.

14thly - After the above distribution of my property I will call the remaining
 part thereof to be equally divided amongst those of my daughters whose names do
 follow Catharine Sturges wife to John Sturges, Mary Clapp wife to John Clapp,
 Christiana Phipps wife to Aaron Phipps, Susanna Gussom wife to Isaac Gussom.

of my daughter Barbara having deceased the sum of five pounds to be paid in cash
to her father George having & give five shillings to be paid in cash.

11th - After the above distribution of my property I will call the remaining
part thereof to be equally divided amongst those of my daughters whose names do
follow Catharine Buffum wife to John Buffum, Mary Clapp wife to John Clapp,
Christina Phipps wife to Aaron Phipps, Mary Benson wife to Isaac Benson,
Philina, Lovina and Sophia Single except so far Catharine Buffum whose name
I first mentioned having previously received from me six pounds each of the others
whose names are mentioned here in connection with her name are therefore to first
draw the sum of six pounds then she to fall in with them and enjoy an equal part.

12th - And lastly I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife Margaret
and my old friend Jacob Leachman to execute this my last will and Testament
in testimony that each and all the aforesaid particulars are perfectly consis-
tent with my desire and that the execution of them should be particularly attended to
by my Executors I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th day of September 1799
