Item I give and bequeath unto my son Reuben Starbuck at the decease of my wife the plantation where I now live with all the buildings and appurtenances thereto belonging, also my wagon & tackle, and all my farming utensils of every kind, also my large chest that was my sea chest.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand son Samiel Starbuck son of Peter deceased one midding good horse and saddle, also one feather bed with cover, and two pillows, two sheets, one blanket & coverlid.

Item I give and bequeath unto my children namely Parnely, Elizabeth, Rachel, Thomas, Ruth, Lydia, Narcas, Reuben, Eunice Starbuck, and

I give unto my daughter Lemuel Starbuck my best
large walnut table, corn & weaving utensils, the cork pots, puter basins, dishes,
knives & forks, shovel & tongs, & all the hand irons in the house forever, and a
comfortable living in the house soe the plantation as long as she remains single.
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Reuben Starbuck at the decease

issue that his her or their part or parts be equally divided among the survivors.

Starbuck and my son Thomas Starbuck Executors jointly of this my last will and

14th day of the third month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.
