5th I will & bequeath to my Niece Jane Watson Daughter of John Watson the sum of Fifty Dollars, I also leave her the last Volume on the Testament of Henry's Works, I also leave her my two year old negro my counterpane, & Blankets my Table Cloth.

6th I will & bequeath to my Wife the sum of Fifty Dollars I also leave her
