last Will & Testament in manner & form following first: Of Divine Pally of all
I recommend my Soul to God who gave it & my body to the earth to be
buried in a decent Christian burial not troubling but I shall receive the
same by the Almightie Power of God - And as touching such Worldly
Estates which God has pleased God to bless me with in this life I Give &
devise in the following manner

1st I Give & devise that all my Just Debts be paid
2nd I Give & devise to my Son George & Andrew all the Tract of Land
on which I live the Wm. & G. tract of 200 Acres as follows -
Beginning at a Hickory the South corner of the Tract containing 200⁰ & 67
32 Acs. to a Stake then N. 28⁰ W. 120 poles to a White Gum then N. 45⁰
E. 45 poles to a White Oak then N. 45⁰ W. 160 poles to a black Jack then S.
45⁰ W. 120 poles to a post Oak then S. 45⁰ W. 273 poles to the beginning
containing 100 Acres - the boundaries of Andrews Port. are as follows beginning
at a Stake the 2nd corner mentioned in Georges containing 200⁰ & 67 poles to
a Hickory then S. 47⁰ W. 272 poles to a post Oak then S. 45⁰ W. 160 poles to a
White Jack then S. 45⁰ W. 160 poles to a White Oak then S. 45⁰ W. 160 poles
to a White Gum then S. 20⁰ E. 120 poles to the beginning containing 100 Acres
& will and devise unto my beloved Wife Barbara One third of said Land
during her natural life

I Give & devise unto my Daughter Sarah One Hundred Dollars -

I Give the Key of my Son Jacob One Hundred Dollars -

I Give to my Daughters Deborah & Mary to each of them One Hundred Dollars.

It is my Will that all my personal property be sold & the money arising therefrom
with what shall be on hand that my beloved Wife Deborah have out of the same
One third part but all the monies & goods above mentioned was first to be
taken out or paid over & the balance then left is equally to be divided
between all my Daughters.

It is my Will that if any of my Children shall die without leaving issue or
Childen, that what I have given them shall return or its Value & be equally
divided among all my Children -

I Give & devise unto all my Children to hold in Common a Negroes family

45th lot 120 poles to a post Oak then the 45th lot 273 poles to the beginning
containing 100 Acre - the boundaries of Andrew's part are as follows beginning
at a Stake the 2nd corner mentioned in George's conveyance to 45th & 60th poles to
a Black Oak then the 45th lot 273 poles to a post Oak then the 45th lot 60 poles to a
Black Jack then the 45th lot 160 poles to a Black Oak then the 45th lot 120 poles
to a White Gum then the 20th & 60th 120 poles to the beginning containing 100 Acre
I will and decree unto my beloved Wife Barbara One third of said Land

taken out & paid over & the balance then left is equally to be divided
between all my Daughters.

It is my Will that if any of my Children shall die without leaving issue or
Issue - that what I have given them shall return or its Value & be equally
divided among all my Children -

I will & decree unto all my Children to hold in Common as Blegers family
shall by name according to Dutch Custom - "the young then got
said Rule"

And I hereby constitute ordain and appoint my true & trusty friends
Christiaan Claess (son of J. Barnett) & Christiaan Jout Executors of this
