1st I give & bequeath to each of my sons & daughters namely, Rebecca Wallengren, William Hunt, Thomas Hunt, Nancy Eggburn, Hannah Perkins, Mary White & Mahala White, have each of them One Dollar Deined & raised out of my Estate.

2^d I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Hannah Hunt all of my household &

Kitchen furniture to be at her own use and disposial -

3^d I give & bequeath to my wife all of my live stock of every sort & kind to be at her disposal

4th I give & bequeath to my Grand son James Hunt all of my farming tools of every sort as his property forever,

5th I give & bequeath unto my Grand son James Hunt all my Land & plantation wherein I now live for him to enjoy forever by his maintaining my Widow with a plentifull support of Provisions so long as she lives my Widow But if James Hunt should die without a lawfull heir my Will is that my daughter Hannah Perkins have the Land which I have willed to him

And lastly I nominate & appoint my grandson James Hunt my whole & sole Executor to this my last will & Testament, Ratifying & Confirming this, and revoking all others heretofore made, signed last, & acknowledged in the presence of us this twenty day of the tenth Month 1839.

In the name of God Omnit. This third day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred & Twenty seven. I Nathaniel Simpson late of the County of Bulgard and State of North Carolina, being in Ordinary ~~to~~ health & of perfect mind Memory, but calling unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make Constitute & Ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following manner & form.

And as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, devise, & dispose of as follows Viz.

I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Sarah Simpson One pair of bed & furniture (the bed we usually sleep upon) and One Cow her choice among my Cows and one side saddle by her freely to be possessed & enjoyed forever. Also further I give to my said wife Sarah Twenty eight Acres of Land on the western end of the tract wherein I now live including my present dwelling house, to be bounded on the West North & South by my present lines or boundaries and on the East by a line running North South between my present dwelling house and that of my son William Simpson which land as above described I give as aforesaid to my well beloved wife Sarah Simpson by her freely to be possessed & enjoyed during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or marriage. I give & bequeath to my well beloved son Robert W. Simpson the above described Twenty eight Acres of Land by him & his heirs freely to be possessed & enjoyed forever, without further encumbrance.
