1st I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Wilson the Home where I now reside and have resided for a number of years with them by acres of land attached to land off the following manner beginning at the North east corner of my land running South with William Beards line to the white oak Marker there and in complements

2^d The remaining part of my estate real and personal I will to be sold by my Executors the Land in a credit of twelve months. The personal Estate also to be sold on a credit such as the Executors in his discretion may see fit for the benefit of the estate and the residue of my Estate after paying all just charges to be equally divided among the other heirs of my Body namely Alexander Martin Sarah Shaw's Aunt John Pelly S. Sherman John C. Martin and John Chadwick Rogers Chadwick the due entitled to one share in the Home of Legatee Chadwick
