of the remainder part of my estate real and personal I give to Dr. Gold by my Executor the land in a tract of twelve months. The personal estate also to be sold on a board foot or the equivalent in the discretion of the Executor for the benefit of the state and the residue of my estate after paying all debts chargeable to be equally divided among the other heirs of my body Nancy Alexander Martin Sarah Davis Anna John Pally S. Sherman John J. Martin and John Chadwick Rogers beholding the due and equal share to each other as the heirs of together shall see fit.
