Ireland Twenty Dollars. Fifthly I Give unto
the Buffaloe Congregation One Hundred Dollars
to be kept in the hands of my Executors for three
years. Sixthly I allow my Negro man Querry to
be set free. at my decease. Seventhly I Give
unto my nephew Isaac Short Twenty Dollars.
Eighthly I Give unto Eliah Shoemaker a Cribbed Boy
Twenty Dollars and further I allow my moving that
I have from home for safe keeping my stock
and household furniture when sold to be equally
divided between my two nephews Margaret
Short and Isaac Short, and John Wilson my friend
but I do not allow the Bow bed & Clock to be sold
but to remain with the House or in the House.

And I allow Margaret Short Forty Dollars more
than what is before mentioned.

I do appoint for my Executors Major Robert Conrad
Latham Conrad Senr and Moses Gilchrist. In witness
hereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this second
day of September In the Year of our Lord 1822.
