Sixthly I allow my Negro Man Qorro to be set free at my decease. Seventhly I Give unto my nephew Isaac Short Twenty Dollars. Eighthly I Give unto Elias Shoemaker a Cribbed Boy Twenty Dollars and further I allow my moving that I have from home for wife & children my stock and household furniture when sold to be equally divided between my two daughters Margaret Short and Isaac Short, and John Wilson my friend but I do not allow the Bow bed & Clock to be sold but to remain with the House or in the House.

And I allow Margaret Short Forty Dollars more than what is before mentioned.

I do appoint for my Executors Major Robert Conrad Latham Donnell Sen^r and Moses Gilchrist. In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this second day of September In the Year of our Lord 1822.

And I allow Margaret Short Forty Dollars more than what is before mentioned.

I do appoint for my Executors Mayor Robert Conard Latham Donnell Sen^r and allow Selchrest. In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this second day of September in the Year of our Lord 1822.
