I James Davis of the County of Guilford and State of North
Carolina in perfect mind and memory do ordain and declare
this Instrument of writing to be my last will and Testament
dismissing all others. I have first I give and bequeath my soul to
God who gave it and my body to be decently buried at discretion
of my executors all my just debts paid - I am ⁱⁿ the state I give and bequeath
it my beloved wife Nabby Davis all the land I possess adjoining

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The lands where I now live, and it also during her natural life or widow hood. Then to my Beloved Son Michael Leaffey Davis to him and his forever I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife her first choice of horses Horses & saddle & her best choice of my cattle two Cows and Calves I give her her choice of my bed Sticks and all the furniture two feather beds two sleds and the half of my bed clothes I give my wife also two Cupboards an armoir and all Cupboard furniture and her choice of Chests. Clocks & Case I also give her one hundred Dollars in Silver. I give her my new Buggay and Gear and all that belongs to the Buggay which I now have, also one team all and Gear which I now have, also all my Smith tools, one plow & one harrow, two horses. This Buggay, Cart, all Smith tools, plow harrow, two horses of my widow manis is to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my wife, John Davis, Jane Leaffey, Michael & me if I remain, my widow until death. These things which the division calls for must be sold then and the money equally divided between John Davis, Jane Leaffey, Michael & Davis these six articles which the division calls for is all I have to my wife to be divided in that way I also give her the head of first of my hogs, four head of Sheep first choice, and one negro girl named Kelley, and one mottled mare named Nehemiah. I give them to my wife during her natural life or widow hood there to be my son Michael & Davis to him his heirs forever. Except Kelley and Nehemiah is to be free of the same Comply with the requirement of the law of this State And if they can't Comply with the law to be free and Michael & Davis should die without an heir of his body Nehemiah & Kelley may choose their own homes where they ~~want~~ to live And is to be sold privately at the valuation of two men.

I also give my wife Adophia Davis all my kitchen furniture I give her 3^{ds} I give and bequeath to my beloved Son John Davis one Thousand dollars which he has already had clear of a note I have in hand at this time against him of one hundred Dollars and the Interest this Thousand dollars he has already had was in money & property which he has I gave him against all my lands Also I give my Son John Davis son James the sum of Twenty five Dollars, then the sum of Four Hundred & Twenty five Dollars to be equally divided between all of his children, my

my cattle two cows and calves I give her her
bed and all the furniture two feather beds two stools and the
rest of my bed clothes I give my wife also two cupboard equivalent
and all cupboard furniture and her choice of sheets. Clocks
I also give her one hundred Dollars in Silver. I give her my new
baggage and gears and all that belongs to the baggage which I now

Dollars. Then the sum of four hundred & Twenty five
son John is to have the interest of this money till his young
child comes of age, if my son John dies before his child

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Comes of age The Interest Thereon My son John Davis
is to draw no Interest on this money till it is taken out of
my Executors hands by the Guardian - Item 5th I give and
bequeath to my beloved daughter Jane Caffey the sum of Eighty
Three Dollars twelve Cents which she has all ready had in property
I give to Robert, and Jane Caffey, my daughter the place where
I formerly lived, supposed to be the size of one hundred & one
Acre the crop tract - one hundred & nineteen acres, And
the sheep tract supposed to be one hundred and twenty-four
Acres. In the same manner left to them the said Robert and
Jane Caffey so long as they both shall live and in this
manner after their death their lands is to be equally divided between
all the aforesaid Jane Caffey's children. I give to my Grandson
James Dilworth Caffey Twenty-five Dollars, and the sum of
One hundred and Seventy-five Dollars to be equally divided
between all my daughters James Caffey's children. Robert Caffey &
Jane is to have the Interest of youngest child comes of age
except Jane Caffey should die then the Interest to the children
Robert and Jane Caffey is to draw no Interest till the money
is taken by a Guardian out of the Executor. Item 5th I give
and bequeath to my beloved son Michael C. Davis Fifty Silver

weight of machined Cotton, twenty five weight of Clean saddle
Flax, Thirty weight of machined Rols of wool, also the Spin
buck, and all the Cloth, twenty five pounds of Coffe, Thirty
weight of sugar, three Gallons of Molasses, three Gallons of spirits
And as much of any kind of Wine as she does cause to keep
for one year, and as much hay and fodder as will feed her Stock
