Name, do make and publish this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form
following that is to say.

Land Containing One hundred & Sixty Nine Acres and Forty Two Poles to have &
to hold during her Natural life or Widowhood, and at her death or Marriage
to be equally divided amongst my lawfull heirs. I further give and bequeath

of the best Cows of my Cattle my whole Stock of Hogs, all my Farming Tools
Household & Kitchen furniture, and also my whole Crop of Corn Wheat Flax
& Cotton during her Natural life or Widowhood, and at her death or Marriage
to be equally divided among my heirs should there be any life known to
belong to the Old Stock.

To my Oldest Daughter Nancy Dilworth I give and bequeath One Bed & one Cow & furniture
to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.

To my eldest son Benjamin Dilworth I give and bequeath One Horse worth Forty Dollars.

To my son Windsor Dilworth I give & bequeath One Horse worth Forty Dollars.

To my second daughter Mary Dilworth I give & bequeath One bed, and one Cow & Furniture
to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.

To my third son George Dilworth I give and bequeath one Horse worth Forty Dollars.

To my third daughter Fanny Dilworth I give and bequeath one bed and one Cow and
Furniture to the Amount of Forty Dollars inclusively.
