mind and memory do make and publish the following as my Last
will & Testament

- Item 1st I wish all my last debt to be paid.
- Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann for and during her
natural life one third of my lands on which I live to be laid off
on the south side including my dwelling House and houses & Barn
also one bed & furniture my saddle horse Hannah and four & below
her choice one herd and her choice & by sheep her choice
- Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my two sons Phillip & McNamey & William
McNamey my fenced lands to be divided between them as follows
to wit after the fenced third part is laid off to my wife I wish one
half of the whole tract to be laid off to Phillip thus beginning at
McNamey & McNamey corner running west ending horse pen at the old
bridge thence a course south west so as to strike a poplar tree on
Joseph Bonner line that is to say I give said Phillip all the land

to be kept on interest & the interest only to be used unless circumstances
make it necessary to use and spend a portion of the principle.

Item 5th I have heretofore given and advanced to my daughter Sarah Bowman
a negro woman named Fida & her two children Martha George & a negro boy
named Will which gift I hereby confirm & which together with the money
and other advancements to me to her heretofore made I value at the sum
of twenty seven hundred & thirty dollars.

Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Wink a negro woman named
Amenda & her child Sufe and a negro man named

which I gave together with the Marwick & have heretofore given her I value at the sum
of Eighteen hundred Dollars

Mem Sixth In addition to the property I have heretofore given and advanced to my son
James provided he set up no other claim against my Estate of any kind I give
and bequeath unto him said James the sum of five hundred Dollars

Mem Eighth I give and bequeath unto my son John one thousand Dollars

Mem Ninth I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Hunt the sum of Eight hundred
and fifty Dollars

Mem Tenth It is my will and desire that all the balance of my property be sold at
the discretion of my Executors or to the best advantage my negroes to be sold at such
time hereafter as in the discretion of my Executors they will command the
best prices and out of the proceeds of such sale to pay over to my son Philip
the sum of Twelve hundred Dollars to my son Bartlett Quincy the sum of Seven
hundred Dollars to my son John fifteen hundred Dollars to my son William
seventeen hundred Dollars and all the balance to be equally divided between
my daughters Sarah Doan Mary Hunt & my sons Bartlett Quincy, Philip
John & William share & share alike
