 Executors Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall re-
 ceive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching
 such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in
 this life I Give demise & dispose of the same in the following
 manner & Form. First I allow as much of my property sold as
 will pay all my Just debts, The balance I Give to my well beloved
 Wife, Mary Weatherly all & singular my lands Negroes & Tenements to
 her freely to be possessed & enjoyed during her Widowhood or life, but after
 Marriage or death to be sold & an equal divide made among all my children
 Except One horse & Saddle that was Tipples I Give to my well beloved Son
 James Weatherly. And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke & disannul
 all & every other former Testament Will legacy bequest & Executors by me
 in anywise before named written & hereunto, ratifying &
 Confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament. In
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Twenty
 fourth day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred
 Sixteen
