Whereas I James Wilson of the County of Hertford & State of North Carolina was
knowing the uncertainty of life & certainty of death & being advanced
in years & somewhat indisposed in body, but of sound mind & memory
do thereto proper to leave the following lines as my last will & testament
principally & first of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it
and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner
at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named and as touching
my worldly substance it has pleased God to bless me with this
my will to dispose of in the following manner Viz —

First It is my will that my just debts & funeral expenses be paid
up and discharged in a reasonable time.

2dly. I give and bequeath to my loving wife Jane Wilson one Cow known
by the name of Blop, and one heifer two years old, two Hogs in the
pen now falling her choice, three barrow sheep and One sow now in
the woods from Shuf, her choice of my flock, two feather beds &
three pieces of furniture, and as much of the household & kitchen
furniture, as she in her discretion may think she will need.
My desk & Cloaths prop I allow to stand in the house for her use
during her natural life.

3rdly. It is my will that all the balance of my Estate to be sold & the
Money to be kept for the use of my wife if she should stand in
need of it the money to remain in the hands of my Executor & to
be advanced to her use as they in their discretion may think she
stands in need of it and at her death all the balance of my
Estate that may remain to be sold & the money arising therefrom
with the Money left in the hands of my Executor for the support
of my wife (if any left) to be equally divided between my
beloved Children Viz Ruth Elliott, Rachel Thornbury, Nancy
Laughlin, Thomas Wilson, Jane Williams Betsy Miller & Allen Wilson
