of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following that is to say first that my Executor
(herein after named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable
to the wishes of my relatives and friend and pay all funeral Expenses
together with my legal debts hereunto to whomsoever owing out of the
income that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my
estate

Item I give and devise unto my son John Unthank one half acre and I
will and devise to my daughter Rachel back my bed furniture
And I will & devise to Allen back one box that my husband had to
put his papers I will and devise to my beloved son John Unthank and
Rachel back all the rest and residue of my estate to equally divide
between them share & share alike be it of whatever name or denomination
that is mine at my decease

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son John Unthank
& my grand son Allen back my lawful Executors to all intents
and purposes to Execute this my last will and Testament according

put the paper I will and devise to my beloved son Mrs Lenthack and
Nathaniel both all the rest and Residue of my estate to equally divide
between them share & share alike be it of whatever name or denomination
that is mine at my decease

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Mrs Lenthack
