

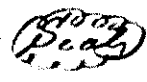

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- 3^d It is my will that at the Death or Marriage of my Widow to give unto my son Jonathan P. Evans my land and Plantation where I now live with the remaining part of my moveable property.
- 4th And Lastly I constitute and Appoint my Trusty Friends Deborah Evans. & David Evans my whole & sole Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal this first day of Ninth month
