being sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given
unto God; calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die; I give devise & dispose of my estate in the following
manner, viz:

I give & bequeath to Aaron Rich one hundred & fifty acres of land joining
Suttons land, and to my wife Phibe Healy all I possess during life, & at her
death Phibe Healy is to have the home plantation, negro Sam and Ned, corner cupboard
chest, bed & furniture piece, to Mary Healy, negro Henry to Phibe Healy Hugh
Healy daughter my watch & rifle gun to Patrick Healy, Hugh Healy ten dollars
in money, Henry to Aaron Rich, & the balance for Phibe my wife to do with as
she sees proper. Except I leave John Brown the bay colt saddle & bridle, confirming
this to be my last will & testament

In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this thirty first of December
eight hundred & nine

N.B. - If Phibe Healy should die before Phibe Healy comes of age the land &
money is to be let out & the money paid to herself & like the negroes coming
to her sisters -

Except I leave John Dunn the bay cott saddle & bridle, confirming this to be my last will & testament

In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this thirty first of December eight hundred & nine

N.B. - If Phibe Healy should die before Phibe Healy comes of age the land & money is to be let out & the money put to her use & like the negroes coming to her sisters -

I make hereby what follows as my last will and Testament.

1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid.

2nd It is my will that my wife have her maintenance of the land I now
live on while she remains my widow also the grain that is now on the place for the
maintenance of her and family.

3rd I give to my son Aaron fifty five acres of land where I now live in
him his heirs and assigns forever, and the balance of the tract I now live on on the
side to be sold also the land adjoining Snows Ferry on the waters of Deep River and the
money to be equally divided between my three eldest sons Joel Benjamin & Aaron.

4th I give to my daughter Rebecca one feather bed & furniture & one
cow and calf.

And the rest of my estate it is my will it should be equally divided
between my wife & my daughter.

I appoint my two sons Benjamin & Elias to execute this will.
