to her and her heirs forever

6th I give & bequeath unto the Children of my deceased Daughter Ann
Henry Two Shillings each to them and their heirs forever

7th I give & bequeath unto the Children of my deceased Daughter Jane
Henry Two Shillings each to them and their heirs forever

8th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Sanders Two Shillings
to her and her heirs forever

9th I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Susan Freeman Two Shillings
to her and her heirs forever

10th I give & bequeath unto the Children of my deceased Daughter Sarah
Freeman Two Shillings each to them and their heirs forever

11th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Annina Hotal Two Shillings
to her and her heirs forever

12th It is my Will that all my Books be equally divided among my surviving
