 my Just Bills and funeral Charges be paid by my Executors hereinafter
 named Item I Give & bequeath unto my son Selah Harris one
 Third of all my moveable property also my best Hat - Item I Give
 & bequeath unto my son Aaron Harris the Plantation tract of land
 that I now live on with all the farming Tools to him this his for-
 ever. I also give him the Large Bible & One third of my moveable
 property Except the Value of One feather Bed & furniture half a
 Dozen of pewter plates & a large Clock which I shall now sell and
 that it sells for it is my will that my Grand daughter Lane
 Harris have when of Age or at her marriage - it is also my
 Will that my Son Aaron have the Shovel & Tongue.
 Item I Give & bequeath unto my Grand son John Harris the Other
 Third of my moveable Property & that all to be sold & divided as is
 Above directed. - Item I Give to my Daughter Hannah Mills
 Ten Shillings. - I also give my Grand Daughter Lane Hodson
 Ten Shillings. - And Lastly I Appoint Constitute & Establish
 my Friend Bethuel Coffin Executor to this my Last will and
 Testament Revoking & annulling all Other Wills here-
 fore made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & printed my Seal this 12th day of the 10th mo 1818
