and Memory Thanks to my kind and Merciful God for his Goodness and
Calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that is
appointed for all men Once to die do make this my Last Will & Testament
in Manner following that is to say I earnestly and first of all my Soul
I would recommend to the Almighty God Who Gave it and My Body I
recommend to the earth to be buried in a Decent Christian Manner at the
Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at that Great day When
my Redeemer shall come in the clouds to Judge the Quick & the Dead I
shall receive the same again and as touching such Worldly Goods as
have pleased God to bless me With I Dispose of and Bequeath in the following
Manner and form In witness Whereof I have set my hand and Seal this
14th day of my Dearest Beloved Wife Martha Porter the Plantation on Which
I Live During her Natural Life With this proviso that I shall have
Sufferer for to sell it or if she should marry again that neither he nor
his Husband nor he can or shall have any power for to sell or make
away with the same and at her death the said plantation appraised
I will give Matthew Young & he here promise to Paying into the Public
Treasury in the City of Raleigh One Dollar per acre for said plantation
And if the said Young does not choose for to pay the said when the
aforesaid Grand then in that case I will it inherit to the aforesaid
Heirs also all the Money Bonds Notes Books & Records & all other Goods
Things and Regs. I do have with all my household Furniture of every
kind I Give to my wife Martha & to her heirs at her death & to her
as she shall I also Bequeath to my Sister Margaret Wiley the sum
of Ten Dollars I also appoint my Wife Martha & Matthew Young Executors &
Guardian of this my Last Will & Testament Acknowledging this & No other
to be my Will In Testimony I have hereunto set My hand hereunto set
My hand & affixed my Seal this Twenty first day of June in the year
of our Lord 1817.

 Polly Wiley Ten Dollars, I Give to my mother One big Coat & flannel Shift
 In the last place I appoint my Trusty Friends Brother David Wiley & Nell. H. Gilmore
 my Executors this I wish to be my Last Will & Testament as I have hereunto
 Set my hand & Seal, this twenty fourth of September in the year of our
 Lord 1817
