

In the name of God Amen, I John Schallert of the County of Guilford
in the State of North Carolina, being sick in body, but sound in mind and
memory, do make or ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say.
That I give and bequeath during her life time one third part of the plantation
on which I now live including the dwelling house, spring of Water, barn and
orchard and Woods sufficient for fuelwood and fencing to my beloved Wife
Mary Magistrate, for her to have and to hold for her use and benefit during
her lifetime, and also all my personal estate of every description to be disposed
of by her and by my Executors for her support and for the payment of my just
debts against my estate.

Next I give and bequeath the above mentioned one third of my land after the
death of my Widow to my daughter Hester and to her heirs and I also give
and bequeath to her and to her heirs immediately, after my death the re-
maining two thirds, or all the rest of my lands for them to have and to hold
as theirs and for their use and benefit.

Lastly, I do hereby appoint my beloved friend and neighbor William Cobb Esq.
as Executor of this my last Will and Testament in Writings signed by me
in my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of August in the year of
our Lord eighteen hundred and forty five
