in the State of both houses, being feeble in body, but sound in mind and
memory, do make or ordain this my last Will and Testimony that is to say
I give and bequeath during her life time on three parts of the plantation
on which I now live including the dwelling house, of my Master James and
Richard and Moses sufficient for himself and his wife to my beloved wife
Mary Maydalone, for her to have and to hold for her use and benefit during
her life time, and also all my personal estate of every description to be disposed
of by her and by my executor for her support and for the payment of my just
debts against my estate.

Next I give and bequeath the abovementioned one third of my lands after the
death of my widow to my daughter Hester and to her heirs and I also give
and bequeath to her and to her heirs immediately after my death the re-
maining two thirds, or all the rest of my lands for them to have and to hold
as their use and for their use and benefit

Lastly, I do hereby appoint my beloved friend and neighbor William both Esq.
as Executor of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I do set
my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of August in the year of
our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty five
