 and value the same at One Hundred and fifty Dollars. I will and devise to my single
 daughter Lucie, Maria, Ann, Pige, Maria, David Sam, Susan Amos, & Maria
 Angell, each one the sum of Fifty Dollars to be paid in money at ten months to be given
 them by my wife & executor. In the same way that I have given to them that are already married.
 I will & devise to my son John & his wife the sum of land on which I live & is usually divided
 between them, and it is my will that my said son John will sell when he or his neighbors to make
 the balance & when made it shall be binding between them. I will & devise that as I have given
 the land to my sons John & Peter, being that they equally pay unto their brother Victor, Washington
 the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars when he shall come of age. I will devise to my
 property at my death, to be remain with my beloved wife Maria & her heirs & together
 enjoy all the surpluses that she now enjoys in working & cultivating the land & raising a
 maintenance for her self & family. As long as she remains my widow, & as my daughter

given and value the same as One Hundred and Fifty Dollars. I will and devise to my single
daughters David, Maria, John, Mary, Sarah, David, Susan, Emily, & Elizabeth
Fugate, each one the sum of Fifty Dollars to be paid in money at ten months to be given
them by my wife & executor. In the same way that I have given to them that are already married.
I will & devise to my Son John & his wife the tract of land in which I live & is usually divided
between them, and I am well that my said Son John will dwell upon him of his neighbor to make
the division & divide. I will be binding between them. I will & devise that do I have given
the land to my Son John & his wife that they equally give unto their daughter Maria Washington
the sum of one hundred and Fifty Dollars when he shall come of age. I will devise to all my
property at my death, to be divided with my beloved wife Maria & her children & explain &
enjoy all the property that she now enjoys in working & cultivating the land & raising a
