In the name of God amen - I John Woodside of the County of Suffolk in the State of Massachusetts being sick & weak in body but of sound and perfect mind, memory, and understanding (blessed be God) do this twenty fourth day of February 1796, make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following (that is to say)

First - I desire, that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid

Secondly - I bequeath unto my wife Hannah Woodside, one third part of my real and a child's part of all my personal property during her natural life

Thirdly - I give and devise unto my beloved sons, William Woodside, Samuel Woodside, John Woodside, James Woodside and Robert Woodside, their heirs and assigns, all my lands to be equally divided among them, respect being had to quality as well as quantity (except as above excepted)

Fourthly - I give and devise unto all my children respectively my personal property to be equally divided among them

Fifthly and lastly, I do hereby make and ordain, my beloved son William Woodside, and my friend Charles Bruce Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby utterly disallowing and disannulling all and every other former wills legacies bequests, and executors, by me in any wise before made or made and bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament
