Carolina & County Guilford being of perfect mind & memory calling to mind the mortality of the body & that it is appointed for all men once to die do commit my soul to God & my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors & as God hath blessed me with the good things of this life do dispose off them in the following manner.

I give my son James my land, three cows four sheep four hogs a negro wench named Kate a child named Sam, one half of all other movables.

I give my son John a negro boy named Sam a cow & yearling the half of all other moveables not disposed off above - I also give my son James to make a deed to my son John for one hundred & twenty six acres of sd. land - I do by these presents constitute

ordain this to be by my last will & testament & as witness my hand & seal this nineteenth day of February 1788

(whom I constitute as my sole executrix &c) one hundred acres of the land
whereon I now live during her life, & likewise such a part of my
movable estate as shall be thought proper for her in a domestic or
house keeping way during her life - & likewise two work creatures &c
enough I likewise give and bequeath to my wife all my household
furniture & my hopes for her & her family's sustenance during her life.

And as for the remaining three hundred acres whereon I now live,
together with the land my father James Wright Senr. now lives (after my
father & mother's decease) 'tis my will that it should be equally
divided among my seven children Alexr. Elijah Wm. Micajah Thomas
