Finally I give & bequeath unto my three daughters Sally Eliza & Patsy Dix, Acres of Land off the East Corner of my Plantations along the branch running Land of George Cannon, including the still houses Spring.

Finally I give & bequeath to my son Joseph McBride the remainder of my land he furnishing his three wives each with a Horse & saddle Valued at Fifty Dollars when demanded by the said Sally Eliza & Patsy McBride I also my daughter Mary McAlly of the Church to live here to live in the house she now occupies, or with her sisters and have just for what ought & hath in her & also allow Joseph half the wharf the other half to Sally Eliza & Patsy. I also allow Mary McAlly & her children their Maintenance this present year out of the crop now in the ground, My Stock & Tackle I leave to my son Joseph. I give & bequeath unto my son Williams Four Dollars. To my son John Two Dollars. To James Two Dollars. To my son Sarah Two Dollars. To my son John Two Dollars. To my daughter Ann Two Dollars. To my daughter Margaret Two Dollars. To be paid by my son Joseph out of my Real Estate when demanded.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my two sons James & Joseph McBride Executors of this my last Will & Testament, constituting this only to be my last Will & Testament.

Fourthly I give & bequeath to my son Joseph McBride the sum of one hundred
in purchasing his three notes each with a Horse & saddle Valued at
Fifty Dollars when demanded by the said Sally Eliza & Rebecca McBride
I also my daughter Mary McAlly of the Cheest to live here to
live in the house she now occupies, or with her sisters and have
out for what coal & such use has I also allow Joseph half the
wharf the other half to Sally Eliza & Rebecca. I also allow Mary
McAlly & her Children their Maintenance this present year out
of the crop now in the ground, My Clock & Table I leave to my
son Joseph. I give & bequeath unto my son William Four

Dollars. To my son John Two Dollars. To James Two Dollars. To my
son Sarah Two Dollars. To my son John Two Dollars. To my
daughter Ann John Two Dollars. To my daughter Margaret Two
Dollars. To be paid by my son Joseph out of my Real Estate when
demanded.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my two sons James & Joseph McBride Executors
of this my last Will & Testament, Constituting this only to be my
last Will & Testament.
